Long-Time Yankton Teacher Now Calls Refurbished School "Home" BY LORETTA SORENSEN

Through all the years that Edith Andersen taught elementary classes at Beadle School for the Yankton Public School District, she never considered that one of the school buildings would eventually become a haven and home for her.

That transition took place when she took up residence in Walnut Village. A mishap in her home first led Edith to Walnut Village. "I had a fall and my son and my niece thought I couldn't function in the house by myself," she said. "I stayed at Walnut Village for a while, got better and returned to my home." When Edith fell and broke her hip after returning home, her need for care brought her back to Walnut Village. "The first time I was here I thought this was such a beautiful place," Edith said. "Everything here is so quiet and restful, and everybody is very kind. I really felt at home, then and now."

Edith was the FIRST Assisted Living resident at Walnut Village. She took her game playing very seriously, loved to walk, enjoyed flowers and was a tremendous help weeding the flower beds. We will all miss Edith very much.
